The purpose of **ALTURAS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL** is to develop the potential of every child so that each child can become a successful citizen with self-respect, critical thinking skills, and an understanding of democratic ideals. Our staff provides an academic program with high standards of student achievement within a comfortable and inviting learning environment. Student work is on display in classrooms and hallways of all the buildings. Two programs continued this year were REACH and Bonus Time for 4th and 5th grade students. In 2008-2009 we implemented a Learning Center for all students to enrich language arts and math, along with technology skills. These programs continue successfully.

District maintenance and custodial crews are outstanding in their success at keeping the site in excellent condition. The initial building, constructed in the 1960s, houses six classrooms, a faculty workroom and lounge, and the administrative complex. The second main building, built in the 1980s, holds eight classrooms, two teacher work areas and a multipurpose room. Additional buildings provide for computer, music, and other classrooms. The school library holds over 13,000 volumes. Students take Accelerated Reader quizzes and use computers as independent workstations to reinforce standards-based skills. All of the Alturas Elementary School staff have designed class web sites for students and parents to access from home computers, from which they may view their child's progress and the class's activities. "Study Island," is a computer program that enriches the math and language arts content standards for K-5.

Parents are an integral part of our school's success and are encouraged to communicate with teachers by email, telephone, or visits. Student progress may be monitored through the district-wide AERIES program. Parents are invited to volunteer. Contact Barry Barnhart for more information. 530 233 7201.
