HDCDS is an alternative environment school serving students in the 7th to 10th grades in the Modoc Joint Unified School District area. The school is located adjacent to the Modoc High School Campus and is self-contained. The student population varies from 5 to 12 at any given time during the year. As a result, much instruction is individualized. HDCDS provides the same academic core curriculum of English/language arts, social science, science, and mathematics that our middle school and high school traditional programs do. Our staff is eager to work with parents to provide an excellent core education for its students, helping them to return to the environment of a traditional school. The school has its own small library, and computer stations are adequate and up to date. Open communication is encouraged with the home, and parents are contacted by classroom teacher on positive incidents and achievements as well as concerns. Parents are welcome to volunteer in the classroom, and are encouraged to communicate with teachers. Student progress may be monitored through the district-wide AERIES program.
