**MMS EXPENDITURES PER STUDENT**

**MODOC MIDDLE SCHOOL** has a structured and friendly climate. Classrooms and hallways are attractive and decorated with student work and subject matter. In a small school like MMS it is possible for staff to know all the students, and they strive to make students comfortable with the environment and with learning.

Homework provides opportunities for students to learn responsibility and practice the concepts they've learned in class. Students are given planner books to help them organize and monitor their assignments. Also, teachers post the week's assignments online. To help students who are behind, MMS schedules a daily homework club.

Our campus is open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily. Classes are from 8:20 a.m. to 2:55 p.m. An advisory period for all students is provided every Tuesday, scheduled for one half hour in the morning and another half-hour in the afternoon. The sports program includes volleyball and flag football in the fall; girls' and boys' basketball in the winter; and track and wrestling in the spring. Parents are an important part of our school community and are encouraged to communicate with teachers by email, telephone, or visits. Student progress may be monitored through the district-wide AERIES program. Parents are invited to volunteer. Contact Mike Martin for more information. 530 233 7201.
